## 2025 Beautiful Earth Rosé (\$35 retail)

Beautiful Earth Rosé is our “always appropriate” wine—the one that makes a random afternoon feel like a plan. It’s meant to be effortless: bright, dry, and refreshing... but still undeniably McPrice.

The 2025 growing season in Paso Robles helped set up exactly that style. We had a cool spring and an unusually mild summer - Paso experienced the mildest July on record and harvest began about a week to 10 days later than average—patterns that generally support freshness, aromatic detail, and balanced acidity (music to a rosé’s ears).

If you’re familiar with past Beautiful Earth Rosé vintages, you know the vibe: pale, pretty, mineral-leaning, and clean. That’s the lane—coastal lift + subtle savory minerality, not sugary fruit salad.

The 2025 edition is the kind of bottle you’ll want chilling in the fridge at all times: for sunny lunches, charcuterie, grilled seafood, a salad that deserves better than water, or those “we didn’t plan dinner but it turned out great” nights.

## **2024 Beautiful Earth White (\$35 retail)**

Beautiful Earth is a white Rhône blend comprised of Grenache Blanc and Clairette Blanche grapes grown on the Westside of Paso Robles from Paper Street Vineyard.

### VINIFICATION

Varietals were whole cluster pressed and cold-fermented separately between 58-60 degrees Fahrenheit in stainless steel. Minimal malolactic acid fermentation. 10 months elevage in stainless steel and neutral 500-L French oak puncheons.

### TASTING NOTES

Stargazer lily, loquat, lemon guava, Asian pear, fresh ginger, miso, crushed minerals. Palate is tactile, energetic, juicy, and lively.

## **2023 Beautiful Earth Red (\$50 retail)**

Beautiful Earth is our flagship Paso Robles blend, and it represents the best lots from our favorite Westside vineyards.

### VINIFICATION

Varietals were fermented separately in small open top bins, concrete, and stainless steel tanks with 10% new oak and 10% whole clusters included. The wine spent 20-35 days on the skins with a combination of pump-overs and punchdowns during fermentation. Aged 18 months in 265-liter barriques, and neutral 500-liter French oak puncheons.

### TASTING NOTES

Black currant pastille, fresh olallieberry, pomegranate syrup, roast pan drippings, chocolate-covered espresso beans, grilled herbs. Palate is luxurious, full and supple, energetic and lively.

## **2023 High on the Hog (\$20 retail)**

High on the Hog is a wine you can drink for any occasion. Around the holiday dinner table in the Myers house, my grandmother would always look proudly around at her family all gathered around the dishes piled high with food, and say, “we are really living high on the hog, aren’t we?” This blend is in memory of my Grandma and her joy at seeing the family doing well.

### VINIFICATION

All varietals were fermented individually. Fruit was destemmed, 3-5 day cold soak, fermented in stainless steel and concrete tanks and small open top bins. 16 months of elevage in neutral 500-liter puncheons, 350-liter cognacs, and 225-, 228-, and 265-liter barriques.

### TASTING NOTES

Black currants, blackberries, bramble spice, ripened blueberries, holiday baking spices, dark chocolate. Soft tannins and lifted fruit-filled aromatics make this a versatile red wine. Drink now through 2030.

## **2022 Bull by the Horns (\$20 retail)**

"Sometimes you have to grab the bull by the horns," is what my father always told me when he smelled a challenge. Today my biggest challenge, and "Bull" so to speak, is Cabernet Sauvignon. I love crafting balanced, textured, decadent Cabernets. But the real challenge is: How do you make great Cabernet for an affordable price? My answer is ... Bull by the Horns.

### VINIFICATION

Fruit was destemmed, 3-5 day cold soak, followed by pump-overs and punchdowns 3 times a day during fermentation. Aged 10 months in stainless steel tanks, and French barriques, 20% new oak.

### TASTING NOTES

Bing cherry, black currant, red licorice, blond roast coffee, cloves, sassafras, grilled herbs. Super fine-grained tannins that glide across the palate.

## 2023 Accoutrements (\$58 retail)

Accoutrements was never meant to be polite. From the beginning, it has been our declaration that the so-called “supporting cast” — the blending varietals — are often the most compelling voices in the cellar. This wine exists because of a simple truth we kept running into while blending our flagship bottlings: time and again, it was the Mourvèdre, Petite Sirah, Petit Verdot, Graciano, Cinsault, and Zinfandel that brought the tension, the intrigue, and the soul. They weren’t accessories. They were the point.

The 2023 vintage gave us the clarity to lean all the way in. Built on a foundation of 38% Mourvèdre, Accoutrements is depth-driven and savory at its core, layered with the dark intensity of Petite Sirah, the architectural frame of Petit Verdot, and flashes of energy from Graciano, Cinsault, and Zinfandel. Each component was fermented and raised on its own terms, then assembled not for volume or ease, but for cohesion — a wine that feels intentional, mineral-driven, and quietly exotic.

This is Accoutrements at its most confident: brooding but lifted, structured yet unexpectedly fluid, with a freshness and polish that belies the strength of its personalities. It’s a wine that rewards attention, evolves in the glass, and reminds us why these varietals have always earned their place at the blending table — and now, unapologetically, at center stage.

### **2023 Altas Viñas (\$58 retail)**

2023 Altas Viñas means "high or elevated vines" which describes Altas Mesa Vineyards 17.5 acres of Mourvèdre and Grenache grow on decomposed granite, gneiss, schist, basalt, and clay loam at 3,200 feet above sea level, making this one of the highest elevation vineyards in the US. Superb clonal selection, tight spacing, huge day/night temperature differentials, and meticulous vineyard work produce grapes that yield vibrant, complex, and compelling wines.

## 2024 Sel De La Terre (\$58 retail)

This wine starts in the soil. Not metaphorically — literally.

Sel de la Terre is Grenache grown on the Westside and treated with respect for where it comes from.

Estate fruit brings density, savory depth, and that unmistakable saline edge. Paper Street delivers brightness, lift, and the snap of minerality that keeps the wine honest. Together, they form a Grenache that feels rooted and alive at the same time.

The 2024 vintage has less emphasis on sheer power and more attention to shape and definition. Red fruit arrives clean and precise — raspberry, pomegranate, citrus peel — followed by darker, more serious tones of tea leaf, crushed stone, and chalk. The texture is firm but not heavy, the finish long without being loud.

This is a wine that doesn't rush you. It settles in, builds slowly, and leaves an impression through restraint rather than insistence. It's the kind of Grenache that reminds you why patience matters — in farming, in blending, and in letting a place speak clearly. If there's a takeaway from 2024, it's this: when the vineyard is this expressive, the best move is to listen.

## 2023 F.A. (\$58 retail)

Mac's Bordeaux-Rhône blend! Renamed in 2021 as F.A. "a thing that has already happened or been decided before those affected hear about it. Leaving them with no option but to accept it."

Paso Robles is known for its fantastic climate for growing Rhône's and Cabernet Sauvignon, and this is a blend of our Estate Vineyard, Paper Street, and Armory. The Cab, Syrah, and Petit Verdot coming off of these vineyards are too good to do anything other than their own bottling, which is why it is a *Fait Accompli*.

Our plush, Paso-born proprietary red — a Cabernet–Syrah–Petit Verdot tête-à-tête — leans into 2023's cooler profile with lifted blue/black fruits, violet, and graphite over polished structure. Prior vintages showed cassis/blueberry richness and sturdy tannins; 2023 layers in brighter acidity and savory detail from the long, slow ripening. Enjoy it now for its generosity, or lay it down to watch the spice and minerality unfold.
